Seán Sammon (2005)</u></b>  The members of our 20 <sup>th</sup> General Chapter challenged you and me to take some responsibility for ensuring that our Marist communities are places where human and spiritual growth are possible. While not an easy task to address, we can rest assured that God will provide the gifts and graces necessary to complete the work (Sammon, 2005).

Reflection	<p><b><u>‘Marvelous Companions’ by Br. Seán Sammon (2005)</u></b></p> <p>Our Marist communities were founded so we could live the Gospel and proclaim the Word of God. Our primary mission is to love God and to make God known and loved (Sammon, 2005).</p>

Reflection	<p>Some of us question our call to community life when solitude becomes a burden. Whether it be early in our days as a brother as we struggle with issues of intimacy, or when facing the sobering reality of personal mortality at midlife, or as we mourn the death of lifelong friends during our final years, we are reminded time and again that we are alone and that community can never lift that weight (Sammon, 2005).</p>

	<p><b><u>‘Marvelous Companions’ by Br. Seán Sammon (2005)</u></b></p> <p>The Solitude and the loneliness that at times accompany our community life, provide us with a means for growing closer to God and other people. Both help us understand that that world and our concerns are not what is most important; there is One who is</p>

	greater than ourselves. Dag Hammarskjöld, who for a time served as Secretary General of the United Nations, put it this way: “Pray that your loneliness may spur you towards finding something to live for, something that is great enough to die for” (Cited by Sammon, 2005).

Reflection	<b><u>‘Marvelous Companions’ by Br. Seán Sammon (2005)</u></b>  The matter of community life is an urgent one in our Institute today. I believe that our Marist mission and way of life will die out eventually in those provinces and districts where ever increasing numbers of brothers are either living alone, or might as well be, considering the little interaction they have with other community members (Sammon, 2005).
Intentions	We pray for our brothers in New Caledonia. For medical doctors and other health workers. <b>First Monday:</b> We pray for our departed brothers, relatives, and benefactors

Reflection	<b><u>‘Marvelous Companions’ by Br. Seán Sammon (2005)</u></b>  In those administrative units where brothers continue to tolerate a level of activism that can only be described as bordering on the pathological, that choice of community life is solely a personal matter, and they therefore continue to find reasons to remain in the same community year after year (Sammon, 2005).
Intentions	We pray for our brothers and works in Hong Kong. We pray for the non-teaching staff in our schools

Reflection	<b><u>‘Marvelous Companions’ by Br. Seán Sammon (2005)</u></b> Religious life was never meant to consist of a group of people who come together solely to live amiably or interact superficially. Rather, we are called to be a searing presence in our world. This end can be accomplished only if we allow God’s will to be mediated through our brothers. This holds true for the composition of our communities as much as it does for the ministries we are asked to undertake in the Institute’s name and in other areas of our life (Sammon, 2005).
Anniversary	In 1871, Marist foundation in Samoa Islands, Pacific.
Intentions	We pray for our brothers and works in the Samoa Islands. We pray for fishermen.

Anniversary	1994, Brother Henri Verges was killed in Algiers, where he had been working for 24 years.
Reminder	End of Canonical Visitation to Tatum Community
Reflection	<b><u>‘Marvelous Companions’ by Br. Seán Sammon (2005)</u></b> Community is one place where the human weakness that you and I carry is very evident. And so, we must often ask ourselves these questions: Are we willing to place our legitimate human needs secondary to the overall goals of the community? Is that fact apparent in the way that we live and pray and share our lives? Are we willing to take responsibility for the life and direction of our communities, or do we spend our time criticizing those who do? (Sammon, 2005).
Intentions	We pray for our brothers and works in Algeria. We pray for the canonization of Brother Henri Vergers.

Reflection	<b><u>‘Marvelous Companions’ by Br. Seán Sammon (2005)</u></b> Discipleship demands that we sacrifice our own comfort, take a number of risks, and act with courage. Jesus was most serious when he offered this challenge: “Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me.” He was equally serious when he promised in return the fullness of life in this biosphere and in the next (Sammon, 2005).

Intentions	We pray for our brothers and works in Koumra, Chad. We pray for people with terminal illnesses.

Reflection	<b><u>'Marvelous Companions' by Br. Seán Sammon (2005)</u></b>  Every Marist community is a group. We can assume therefore, that rather than remaining static, each one will pass through a series of stages from the time its members first gather until the community comes to an end, due to the departure of some brothers or the addition of new ones (Sammon, 2005).
Intentions	We pray for the Brothers who introduced us to the Marist Way of Life. We pray for all our brothers in active service. <b>Marist Saturday:</b> We offer special prayers for our vocation

Anniversary	In 1840, Father Champagnat received the Oil of the Sick and gave his final blessing.
Reflection	<b><u>'Marvelous Companions' by Br. Seán Sammon (2005)</u></b>  For most of us, the first stage in the life of any community we join includes a period of orientation. Beginnings are usually fraught with difficulties; in an unfamiliar situation we all need some time to get our bearings. Entering a new community, for example, you and I might find ourselves trying to find our place in the group. If we are feeling anxious and uncertain, we can easily start comparing our new living situation with the one we recently left (Sammon, 2005).
Intentions	For our elderly and sick Brothers. For our community superiors.
<b>May 12<sup>th</sup>      Monday of the 4<sup>th</sup> Week of Easter. Psalter: Week 4.</b> Optional Memorial: Nereus and Achilleus, martyrs. Optional Memorial: Pancras, martyr <b>Vestment: White, or Red</b>	

Liturgy	Acts 11:1-18 “God can grant even the pagans the repentance that leads to life.” John 10:1-10 “I am the gate of the sheepfold.”
Birthday	Brother Owen Ormsby (USA) worked in Liberia
Reflection	<b><u>‘Marvelous Companions’ by Br. Seán Sammon (2005)</u></b> During this first stage in our new community, its veteran members need to be careful not to spend all their time discussing people and events with which they alone are familiar. If they do, those new to the group need to point out what is happening or they run the risk of finding themselves increasingly excluded from day-to-day conversation (Sammon, 2005).
Intentions	We pray for Brother Owen, his intention, and his community. We pray for our parents, both living and dead.
<b>May 13<sup>th</sup> Tuesday of the 4<sup>th</sup> week of Easter. Psalter: Week 4</b> <b>Optional Memorial: Our Lady of Fatima</b> <b>Vestment: White</b>	
Liturgy	Acts 11:19-26 “They started preaching to the Greeks, proclaiming the Lord Jesus.” John 10:22-30 “The Father and I are one.”
Anniversary	2003 Death of Brother Justin Keady from Britain, who (worked in Cameroon).
Reflection	<b><u>‘Marvelous Companions’ by Br. Seán Sammon (2005)</u></b> The task of drawing up a <i>Plan for Community Living</i> is also often addressed at this time, when new members join. Even if the community had a Plan the previous year, its details should be discussed and renegotiated. Such action is imperative whenever the membership of the community changes (Sammon, 2005).
Intentions	We pray for the catechists of our home parishes. We pray for an end to the crisis in Cameroon.
<b>May 14<sup>th</sup> Wednesday of the 4<sup>th</sup> week of Easter. Psalter: Week 4</b> <b>Feast: Matthias, Apostle</b> <b>Vestment: Red</b>	
Liturgy	Acts 1:15-17,20-26 “The lot fell to Matthias and he was listed as one of the twelve Apostles.” John 15:9-17 “You did not choose me, no, I chose you.”
Anniversary	1997: Death of Brother Gall Hanley from Britain who worked in Cameroon.
Reminder	End of Canonical Visitation to Bafut Community
Reflection	<b><u>‘Marvelous Companions’ by Br. Seán Sammon (2005)</u></b> What happens in the life of one of our brothers in our community has ramifications for all who make up the group. While we generally prefer to classify the person who is causing all the trouble, at least from our point of view, as the source of difficulty, in remaining silent we collude with that person and add to the group’s dysfunction (Sammon, 2005).

Intentions	We pray for all the students in our schools. For those working for the improvement and protection of our environment..

Liturgy	Acts 13:13-25 "God has raised up one of David's descendants, Jesus, as saviour." John 13:16-20 "Whoever welcomes the one I send welcomes me."
Anniversary	In 1876, first Marist school opened in New Zealand.
Reflection	<b><u>'Marvelous Companions' by Br. Seán Sammon (2005)</u></b> Learning to disagree and to resolve differences in our community are skills that can be acquired. And learn them we must! What other alternatives do we have? To wring our hands in despair about the state of our local community? Such behavior, as we well know, will do little to change the quality of life within the group (Sammon, 2005).
Intentions	We pray for our brothers and works in New Zealand. For God's protection over street children.

Reflection	<b><u>'Marvelous Companions' by Br. Seán Sammon (2005)</u></b> Having agreed that it is safe to disagree, the community members can speak honestly about their hopes and disappointments, and arrive at a consensus about the details of their life together. Who will manage the group's finances? How often and in what manner will its members pray in common? What responsibilities do they have to one another? These are but a few of the many questions that must be addressed (Sammon, 2005).
Intentions	For those who have difficult work to do. For all politicians and world leaders.

Liturgy	Acts 13:44-52 "We must turn to the pagans." John 14:7-14 "To have seen me is to have seen the Father."

Reflection	<b><u>'Marvelous Companions' by Br. Seán Sammon (2005)</u></b> Obviously, our Marist <i>Constitutions and Statutes</i> have a particularly important role to play in the life of the group at this stage. If we are committed to forming a community that will be a source of spiritual, emotional, and interpersonal growth, we will need to discuss as a group the directives found in that document and in the <i>Message</i> of our 20 <sup>th</sup> General Chapter (Sammon, 2005)

Intentions	For all immigrants across the world. For the communications commission and respective teams in our Province. <b>Marist Saturday:</b> We offer special prayers for our vocation
<b>May 18<sup>th</sup></b>	<b>Sunday of the 5<sup>th</sup> week of Easter. Psalter: Week 1</b> <b>Vestment: White</b>
Liturgy	Acts: 14:21-27 “They gathered the church together and declared all that God had done with them.” Revelation 21:1-5a “He will wipe away every tear from their eyes.” John 13:31-33a,34-35 “A new commandment that I give to you, that you love one another.”

Anniversary	In 1840, the Spiritual Testament of Father Champagnat was read to the Brothers assembled around his bedside.
Reflection	<b><u>‘Marvelous Companions’ by Br. Seán Sammon (2005)</u></b> First of all, we need our Marist Documents to clarify what we mean by the word community, in light of the multicultural world in which the Institute finds itself, and the traditions handed down to us since our founder’s time. Community wears many different faces in the church and our world today, and not every religious institute defines this expression in quite the same way (Sammon, 2005).
Intentions	We pray for fidelity to the wishes of our Founder. For all our brothers who are studying.
<b>May 19<sup>th</sup></b>	<b>Monday of the 5<sup>th</sup> week of Easter. Psalter: Week 1</b> <b>Vestment: White</b>
Liturgy	Acts 14:5-18 “We have come with good news to make you turn from these empty idols to the living God.” John 4:21-26 “The Advocate, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything.”
Reflection	<b><u>‘Marvelous Companions’ by Br. Seán Sammon (2005)</u></b> There are many ways to live out community life. One point is quite clear: in our Institute, community life entails living together physically, face to face, and being involved intimately in the life of the group. We read that message in the chapter on Community Life found in our <i>Constitutions and Statutes</i> , namely, article 82, which reads “Ours is a community apostolate. It begins with the witness of the consecrated life we live together (Sammon, 2005)
Intentions	We pray for social justice and equality in the countries where we work. For our brothers in international missions in solidarity with the church.

Reminder	End of Canonical Visitation to Manuel Jorques Community
Reflection	<p><b><u>‘Marvelous Companions’ by Br. Seán Sammon (2005)</u></b></p> <p>The whole community shows its apostolic solidarity by affirming and encouraging each of its members in his apostolic ministry. There can be no doubt that community life was central in Marcellin’s vision of our life. In his circular letter of August 12<sup>th</sup>, 1837, he wrote,” How pleasant, how flattering it is for me to think that in a few days I shall have the wonderful pleasure of saying to you, with the psalmist, while embracing you, ‘Quam bonum et quam jucundum habitare fratres in unum.’ It is a delightful consolation to me to have you all together again one in heart and mind, as a single family, seeking only the glory of God and the good of his holy religion” (Sammon, 2005).</p>
Intentions	In thanksgiving for the gift of Father Marcellin Champagnat to our world. For the people of Le Rosey, where Father Champagnat was born.
<p><b>May 21<sup>st</sup>      Wednesday of the 5<sup>th</sup> week of Easter. Psalter: Week 1</b>  <b>Optional Memorial: Christopher Magallanes, presbyter, martyr and companions</b>  <b>Vestment: White, or Red</b></p>	
Liturgy	<p>Acts 15:1-6 “It was arranged that they should go up to Jerusalem and discuss the problem with the Apostles and elders.”</p> <p>John 15:1-8 “Whoever remains in me, with me in him, bears fruits in plenty.”</p>
Anniversary	In 1789, baptism of Father Champagnat. He was given the Christian name of Marcellin Joseph Benedict.
Reflection	<p><b><u>‘Marvelous Companions’ by Br. Seán Sammon (2005)</u></b></p> <p>Our Marist <i>Constitutions and Statutes</i> tell us that the community has a community superior or leader, who “creates a climate of understanding and harmony among his brothers. His role is to encourage and coordinate the common effort and to ensure both its continuity and unity” (Sammon, 2005).</p>
Intentions	<p>We pray for the success of our annual retreat this year.</p> <p>We pray for our Spiritual Directors and Accompanators.</p>

Birthday	Br Aureliano Garcia, Provincial of the Mediterranean, who work in Ghana.
Anniversary	In 1810, birth of Brother Louis-Marie, 2 <sup>nd</sup> Superior General. (Reference: Reflection of June 5, 2025 Religious Calendar).

	In 2002, death of Brother Cayetana, Quitana, one of the founders of Cote d'Ivoire.

Reflection	<p><b><u>'Marvelous Companions' by Br. Seán Sammon (2005)</u></b></p> <p>Despite the inspiring words about the community superior, few brothers in the Institute today are lining up to take on the role of a community or local leader. Some feel ill-equipped for the challenge and insist that they lack the necessary skills. As one told me recently, "In my Province today, to be a local superior you need the skills of a spiritual director, a therapist, and an expert in conflict resolution, and have the good sense to know that at the end of the day some people are not going to change!" (Sammon, 2005).</p>

Reflection	<p><b><u>'Marvelous Companions' by Br. Seán Sammon (2005)</u></b></p> <p>A local Marist leader has three responsibilities: one, to interview the brothers in his community; two, to animate the group's prayer; three, to call community meetings. He does not have to take responsibility for implementing all three, but he must initiate each. In so doing, he comes not only to appreciate more fully the lives of his brothers; he also comes to understand more profoundly the dynamics that are present when any group of people lives together (Sammon, 2005).</p>
Intentions	<p>For our aspirants and their parents.</p> <p>For our community bursars.</p>
<p><b>May 24<sup>th</sup> Saturday of the 5<sup>th</sup> week of Easter. Psalter: Week 1</b></p> <p><b>Vestment: White</b></p>

Anniversary	<p>In 1920, end of the term of Brother Stratonique, 5<sup>th</sup> Superior General, and election of Brother Diogene, 6<sup>th</sup> Superior General.</p> <p>In 1961, the General House was transferred from Saint-Genis-La Vall to Rome.</p> <p><b>Marist Saturday:</b> We offer special prayers for our vocation</p>
Reflection	<p><b><u>'Marvelous Companions' by Br. Seán Sammon (2005)</u></b></p> <p>While most community superiors accept some of the responsibilities, a number will shrink from interviewing the brothers. Some protest: "I am neither a psychologist nor a social worker." To which I would reply, "Thank God!" For as important as these roles might be within a number of cultures, a community leader is meant to be, first of all, a brother among his brothers. His interest in them and</p>

	in the details of their lives is fraternal. He serves them best as a listening ear (Sammon, 2005).
Intentions	We pray for the Superior General and his council. We pray for workers in the factories.
